Wedgwood

Class Wedgwood have had a brilliant half term.

In English, this term, we have been working on stories with a familiar setting. We have been working on stories around different celebrations. The children have read stories about birthday's, bonfire night, Diwali and Christmas. The children have enjoyed a variety of activities such as creating poems, using their senses to create descriptive writing, joining in with rhymes and songs and created some fantastic pieces of writing. The children also created some lovely letters for Father Christmas.



In Maths this term, some children began the half term learning how to understand the operation of subtraction. The children played subtraction games, solved number problems and began to create subtraction sentences. They also worked on sequencing and writing numerals to 20. After this, the worked on adding and subtracting from a whole number.

Other children began the term becoming familiar with the Numicon shapes. The completed activities such as matching the Numicon by shape or colour. They used the Numicon to create images using overlays and created patterns. After this, they began to work on ordering Numicon in the correct sequence and adding the numeral to a Numicon shape.



In Science, class Wedgwood have continued their work around every day materials. The children created their own fireworks in a jar and created fireworks on filter paper. They then moved on to waterproof materials and tested a variety of materials to see if they were waterproof or non-waterproof. After this we moved onto states of matter and the children completed a test to see how quickly they could melt an ice cube. The children also worked on natural and man-made materials, absorbent materials and using materials for a purpose such as creating their own music shaker bottles.



In Topic, Class Wedgwood have continued to work on The Great Fire of London. The children began the half term by creating 2D and 3D models of a Tudor house during their Design and Technology sessions. They then moved on to patterns and explored the patterns that the Tudors would have used. They used this knowledge to create their own abstract art. The children also explored food from the Tudor era and took part in a Tudor banquet.

During their Geography sessions, the children have completed some map work and particularly enjoyed exploring London on Google maps and finding Pudding Lane, where the Great Fire of London began.


Minton

During our Maths lessons, we have been focusing on number skills and specifically developing our knowledge of subtracting and addition. The children were able to practise their new skills that they have developed through lots of practical activities as well as going off site to develop adding and subtracting skills through the use of money. The children have also been developing their time skills by identifying different times of the day by using the day board to support.

During English, we have continued to read classic books. This half term we have continued to sequence the different parts of the story but also added recapping and recalling the stories in different ways. We have all been working on our phonics skills and letter formations throughout the half term.





In Maths this half term, the children have been exploring a range of different topics. This has included working on numbers to 20, adding and subtracting one and two from whole numbers up to 10 and talking through how to write calculations. We have recognised adding and subtracting two numbers up to 10 in a variety of scenarios. One of our groups have been focusing on number trios, using number lines and using 10's to complete answers.

During Science this half term, we have been exploring different materials and states of matter. We have explored the materials in the classroom, grouped the same together and then talked about the differences between liquids and solids. We have also thought about what is the best way to get solids out of liquids and the results were unanimous that our hands were the best to get the solid objects out.

Throughout our Topic sessions this half term, we have continued to learn about the Roman Empire. We have learnt about how the Roman Empire has helped us in Modern Day Britain today including the road, rail and water systems have. We have explored different types of pottery and have used clay to design and make our own pots.

Throughout this term, we have worked hard in our sessions so we have had some reward trips. We have been out to look around different shops including charity ones to find appropriate items for the shoebox appeal for Christmas. We voted to make a box for a 3–5-year-old boy. We have also been fortunate enough to go for breakfast in Asda for a treat.



In RE this half term, we have been working on people who help us. We have walked round the local area to find people who help us. We visited the local charity shop, pharmacy, town hall and the police station where we were fortunate enough to spend a few minutes with two police officers discussing their job.

English

Finishing the term with some great discussions.

Science

In Science we have been learning all about the heart and blood vessels and how to describe the components of blood. We then learnt the importance of Scientific questions. We then learnt all about the functions of the bones in a skeleton. We have learnt about the positive effect of legal and illegal drugs and their effects on the body. We completed an experiment learning our reaction times.

Topic

Over the last few weeks, we have been learning all about D&T during these sessions we have been discovering all about different fabrics we looked at what fabrics are used for and why they are the best material. We learnt to make our own item using a suitable material. We also learnt how to use a sewing machine and created different stitches. We then moved on to art where we have researched different cultures and the importance of mythical creatures. We then discovered how to print patterns creating our own pattern.

We all worked together to make cards for our local community, just look at the lovely cards we made and sent!



Moorcroft

Class Moorcroft have had a great half term leading up to the Christmas break and they have completed some great work. The children have made great progress in their academic development but also in the children's social ability to interact with others.

In Maths the children have all covered a range of different topics within their Key Stage area. Key Stage 2 covered a range of topics dependent upon their stage of work. Some children have developed a great ability complete simple addition and subtraction questions using a range of methods. They have also looked at shapes being able to describe them using the correct



terminology. The children in Key Stage 2 have developed some great knowledge this term which we will continue to build on during the next academic term.

The children in Key Stage 3 have been able to show a great development of their understanding they have covered topics such as place value, addition and subtraction of 3and 4-digit numbers before paying focus to estimating before moving on finally to capacity. The children covering functional skills have shown fabulous resilience and have covered a range of topics which will meet the criteria of their exam such adding and subtracting fractions. The children have engaged in mock exams and then have developed a knowledge where they have made great progress in their scores.

In English the children have engaged in some great sessions and developed their English ability showing some great knowledge and where some have worked on their phonetical knowledge and spelling. The Key Stage 2 children in English began the half term looking at persuasive devices. The then explored play scripts and the different features. They finished the term looking at letters where they wrote a fantastic letter to Santa.

Key Stage 3 within their English lessons has gained some basic skills to aid their writing this term where they have looked at a range of writing techniques. The children during this half

term have paid attention to the different factors which impact language and people's accent. The children looked at idiolect, dialect and sociolect where they considered what influences our language. The children used their knowledge to then write a great piece of writing where they wrote an information text about language.

The Key Stage 4 children have worked extremely hard

this term where they began to use a range of language techniques effectively which has in turn improved their writing. During the term the children have completed some great descriptive writing where they have needed to use their senses to describe a certain place.



The children have created some amazing pieces of writing, showing a good ability to proof read.



During our other subjects we have covered a range of different topic areas. The Key Stage 2 children have been exploring the Anglo Saxons and Vikings where we have covered our geography and design and technology focus. The children have enjoyed being extremely practical in sessions where they have designed and then created a range of objects including an Anglo-Saxon house from natural materials.

They Key Stage 3 children during our Topic sessions, have covered art and geography. In art the children enjoyed exploring different cultures and how this impacts art. The children then paid focus to the technique of printing before trying this for themselves.

They Key Stage 4 children have shown some fantastic resilience within their BTECS and they have worked hard to complete their personal progression plan and beginning their first unit of work.



In Science the Key Stage 2 children have been looking at forces. The children began by looking at the push and pull force where they were able to explore the school to find different examples of each. The children then moved on to look at magnetism, they hunted for different magnetic materials before looking at the uses for magnets where they developed a great understanding through practical activities.

In our Science sessions, the Key Stage 3 children have

explored the human body and the different organs looking at the purpose. During the end of the half term the children looked at how organisms adapt and constructed a range of food chains.

Over the term the children have also engaged in a range of different diversity events where they have really enjoyed partaking in practical activities and developing their social, moral, cultural and spiritual understanding. Class Moorcroft



worked well as a team to organise the school shoe box appeal where



we collected and delivered 16 shoeboxes for vulnerable children in Ukraine. They should be very proud of their attitude and how they conducted themselves.


The children have continued to build fantastic relationships with both their peers and staff. They have showed great development towards their targets and should all be proud of their work.


Coalport

Coalport class have ended the first term extremely well. Pupils have continued to develop friendships, confidence and have had a lot of fun whilst doing this!

In our Science sessions, we have been learning all about the heart, blood vessels and how to describe the *components of blood*. We then went on to investigate the human skeleton, we considered the purpose and importance of this. Finally, we went on to focus on scientific questions. We identified that asking these questions is part of the scientific method, which includes, making observations, forming a hypothesis and testing this. We then went on to highlight the characteristics of a good scientific question.



During our English lessons, we have been working on the topic **'Your Language'**. Pupils have been able to understand that the language you use is completely unique to **you**. We highlighted that how you use language reflects who you are as an individual. It can show where you are from, how old you are and your interests and beliefs. Rightly or wrongly, we often judge people by the way that they speak. Pupils engaged in some fantastic discussion about this and shared their views in a mature manner. Moving forward, we looked at key terminology relating to the subject area including, accents, sociolect, dialect and idiolect. We also considered how someone's idiolect can be portrayed in written language through the use of eye dialect.



Pupils have engaged with this unit thoughtfully and produced a fantastic guide to Spoken Language for their final showpiece.

During our Topic sessions, Coalport class have covered Design and Technology. They began the term by exploring '**Materials**'. We examined how fabrics are made, their properties and why they are fit for a purpose. Pupils particularly enjoyed the practical elements of this unit. They created their own tie dye t-shirt and socks by adapting fabrics. The outcomes looked fantastic!





In Maths, we have mastered **techniques to improve mental** calculations including partitioning and distributive law. Pupils have now developed their confidence and can speedily solve problems mentally!



Coalport class have had a fantastic end to the year. We have enjoyed getting in to the festive spirit. We went on a great trip to Manchester Christmas markets!


The pupils have settled incredibly well into our new classroom and have engaged in learning brilliantly throughout this half term.

During English this half term, we have developed our understanding of formal and informal language and writing letters to different types of people. We have practiced our alliteration and how to use it for descriptive writing. The pupils have worked hard to first create a descriptive and persuasive poster and finished the half term by writing a descriptive piece including the five senses.

We have focused on Chemistry in Science this half term. We have learned about different groups on the periodic table and their properties. Over the last couple of weeks, we have been learning about fuels and the world's atmosphere. We have discovered the different gases that the atmosphere is made up of and how it has changed over the years. 

Doulton




What a fabulous term class Doulton have had, in math's we have been looking at converting different measurements as well as looking at equivalent fractions.

learning about calculating the mean, mode, median and range of data sets!



English


